#### Parable of Sower (Luke 8:4-15)

- How I've looked at this before:
  - Jesus is speaking to sowers
  - Purpose is to prepare us for the different responses people will have to the gospel
  - Sound familiar?

### Parable of Choices (Luke 8:4-15)

Parable delivered to the multitude, not disciples. Must be a message for the multitude



If not a message for sowers, must be teaching a lesson to the soil

"You will all respond differently to the gospel" doesn't teach anything

### Parable of Choices (Luke 8:4-15)

- Parable about
   choice. You get to
   choose how to
   respond to God's
   Word.
- Not a one-time choice.

- You choose your response every time you encounter His Word (Jam. 1:21-25)
- It's not about who you are, it is about what you choose. You become what you choose

What happened to the Young Prophet? (1 Kings 13:1-24)
God sent him Word: Send a message to Jeroboam, do not eat or drink, or return the same way (1-3, 9)

Jeroboam offers food and he refuses: Good soil! (7-10)
Old Prophet offers food and he refuses: Good soil! (15-17)
The Old Prophet's lie doesn't change God's Word, but the Young Prophet chooses to reject the Word in favor of the cares of this world: Bad soil! (18-19)

- No growth and no fruit without the seed
- Need to encounter Word constantly. More encounter is more opportunity to choose to be good soil and bear fruit (Deut 11:18-20)
- Bring Word into life constantly
   because sometimes haven't prepared
   heart/soil to hear truth from His
   Word (Deut 31:19-21)

#### Why do you choose to be bad soil?

- Don't want to hear what God is trying to tell you right now and choose not to understand (Matt 13:19). Can always find a way and reason not to understand even plain truths
- Not committed to doing what God's Word requires. Not willing to give up everything (Luke 14:33). As precious as you find relationship with God now, eventually God will call for sacrifice don't want to give (Rich young ruler)
- - Choose this world over God's Word. Choose to believe will be better off serving your desires over God's (Deut 8:3). Weeds creep in and must be vigilant

Bad News: No matter how you've chosen to respond to God's Word in the past, you can make a different choice

# NEXT EXIT GOD'S WAY



• Solomon (1 Kings 11:1-13)

- Sought God and filled with wisdom
- Didn't lose wisdom but chose to respond to his wives over God's Word late in life

Bad News: No matter how you've chosen to respond to God's Word in the past, you can make a different choice

# NEXT EXIT GOD'S WAY



• Joash (2 Chron 24:15-22)

- Sought God during days of Jehoida and rebuilt temple
- God's Word didn't change, but chose to listen to princes instead of God's Word

### NEXT EXIT GOD'S WAY

• Manasseh (2 Chron 33:1-17)

- Wicked king served idols in temple and would not listen to God (10)
- Chose to humble himself to God's Word and become good soil and removed idols

Good News: No matter how you've chosen to respond to God's Word in the past, you can make a different choice



- Saul of Tarsus (Acts 19:1-19)
  - Persecuted church established by God. God's Word was intended to bring him to Christ (Gal 3:24) but he chose to be bad soil that opposed God
  - Chose to hear and respond to God's Word and then prove from same scriptures Jesus is the Christ (Acts 17:2-3)

**Evangelistic Message?** 

You can never tell what soil anyone will choose to be this time

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• Must be tireless in presenting God's Word, because maybe they will be good soil THIS time (2 Tim 4:2)

- God demands and deserves fruitfulness
- Must choose to be good soil every time encountering His word
